The following Options and Security bits should be reviewed prior to using Eagle Pharmacy.

Option 460

Enter Display After Scan?

Display After Scan?

D	Display after Enter. Only use this option if you do not use scanners at f
L	Display SKU description quantity price after UPC scan.
N	Only the SKU displays after a UPC scan.
Y	Display price description qty. ava. QOH QOO Mfg. part number cost.

This field determines what displays at POS when a UPC is scanned or a SKU is entered.

D = The SKU automatically displays after the clerk fills in the Item (SKU) field and presses ENTER. Only use this option if you do not use scanners at POS.

L = The following information displays when a UPC is scanned at POS:

- SKU
- description
- quantity
- price

N = Only the SKU displays.

Y = The following information displays when a UPC is scanned at POS:

- price
- description
- quantity available
- quantity-on-hand
- quantity-on-order
- manufacturer's part number
- cost (optional)

Note: POS option 8286 controls what is displayed when option 460 is set to D.

Kept By Store

This option is also in Eagle function MIV.

If Option 460 ('Display' After Barcode Scan?) is set to "D", then Will Call functionality at POS will be disabled.

Option 1344

Enter Controlled Substance

This option determines if controlled substance tracking is available on the system. Controlled substance items are identified by a pharmacy management system. Thus this feature requires an interface with a pharmacy management system that supports controlled substance tracking. When a prescription is identified as a controlled substance Eagle for Windows Point of Sale will prompt the clerk to enter information about the person picking up the prescription. This information includes their ID, ID Type, ID Expiration date, First Name, Last Name, Address, City, State, Zip, Date of Birth and Relationship to patient. The information is passed back to the pharmacy management system. No reporting of Controlled Substance information is available from the Eagle system. The Pharmacy management system is responsible for transmitting or reporting the Controlled Substance pickup information to the appropriate state or federal agencies.

Kept By System

A password is required to change this.

Set this option to YES to enable controlled substance tracking on the system.

Option 9171

Enter Filled Prescription Flow

Filled Prescription Flow

A	All Together w/Name & Address
B	Choose Name & Address
D	Different Lists

What flow is used when Point-of-Sale displays a list of filled prescriptions for clerk selection.

A = Always display all prescriptions together with the Patient Name, Street Address, Medication, Date Filled and Rx#.

B = If the prescriptions are for different patients or addresses ask the clerk to choose the patient. When prescriptions are listed for one patient/address they show Medication, Date Filled and Rx#.

D = Show version (A) for multiple patients/addresses. Show version (B) for a single patient/address.

Kept By System

Option 9171 allows you to determine the flow that is used when Point of Sales displays a list of filled prescriptions.

Option 9173

Enter Pharmacy sku

Pharmacy sku

This option determines which sku prescription items post to when passing to Eagle via the pharmacy interface. Additionally, entering the pharmacy sku will cause POS to initiate the pharmacy interface in the event a pharmacy barcode is not readable or a register's barcode scanner is down.

Kept By System (can be changed)

Option 9173 lets you set which abbreviation is used for your Pharmacy SKU. Best Practice is to use RX.

Option 9180

Enter Prompt For Safety Caps

If set to Yes, POS will prompt the clerk 'Does the customer required safety caps?'

Note: If the PMS system sends over a safety cap value setting this option to Yes causes POS to ignore the NoSafetyCaps value coming from the PMS system and always prompt.

If set to NO, POS will not prompt the clerk and post the message comment 'Safety Cap Refused' on the transaction.

Note: If the PMS system sends over the safety cap value this option should be set to No.

If set to Off. POS will not prompt the clerk and no safety cap comment will post on the transaction.

Values X and W only work if option 9171 = P (PDX / EPS). When this option is set to X or W, if the PDX or EPS interface sends the value to prompt the clerk to ask the customer if they want safety caps, the interface will change the value to either Yes or No causing Eagle for Windows to not prompt the clerk to ask the customer for their safety cap preference. Descriptor lines will post according to the rules when PDX or EPS sends a Yes or No.

Kept By System (can be changed)

Set this option to Yes to prompt the clerk to ask whether the customer needs safety caps. Best Practice is to set this to W- Default Ask to YES.

Option 9181

<p>Setting this option to Yes causes POS to prompt the clerk to ask the customer if they want a pharmacist consultation when the pharmacy SKU is sold.</p> <p>Values X and W only work if option 9171 = P (PDX / EPS). When this option is set to X or W, if the PDX or EPS interface sends the value to prompt the clerk to ask the customer if they want a pharmacist consult, the interface will change the value to either Yes or No causing Eagle for Windows to not prompt the clerk to ask the customer for their pharmacist consult preference. Descriptor lines will post according to the rules when PDX or EPS sends a Yes or No.</p> <p>Kept By System (can be changed)</p>									

Set this option to Yes to prompt the clerk to ask whether the customer needs a pharmacy consultation. Best Practice is to set this to X- Default Ask to NO.

Option 9183

Enter Pickup Signature Note

<p>If the pharmacy capture prescription pickup signature is set to Yes allows you to determine the verbiage that displays on the signature capture pad. In Options maintenance you can create pharmacy notes. The first four lines of the note identified by this option will display when the user is prompted to sign for their pharmacy pickup.</p> <p>Kept By System (can be changed)</p>	

Setting this option to YES allows you to change the verbiage that is displayed on the signature capture pad. The notes that are displayed here can be created in Options Maintenance.

Option 9189

Set this option to YES to allow for consolidated pharmacy signatures.

Option 9190

Enter Consolidate Note

Only relevant when Option 9189 "Consolidate Pharmacy Signatures" is set to Yes.

If the consolidate pharmacy signatures option is set to Yes this option determine which pharmacy note to use to display verbiage on the signature capture pad. In Options maintenance you can create pharmacy notes. For consolidated signatures, the first four lines of the note identified by this option will display when the user is prompted for the consolidated pharmacy signature.

Kept By System (can be changed)

Use this option to direct the Eagle system to the note to be used for Consolidated Pharmacy Signatures.

Set this option to Yes to post drug and patient name when posting an RX item on a POS transaction. These names are posted as separate descriptor lines. Note that this option only works if the pharmacy system is capable of passing the information in the interface.

Kept By System

Set this option to yes to post drug and patient names when posting RX item on Point of Sales Transactions. This option only works if the pharmacy is capable of passing information on the interface.

Option 9765

Enter Delivery tickets printed

**This option determines the quantity of delivery prescription tickets to print.
This is only available if pharmacy delivery is available in the PMS interface.**

Kept By System (can be changed)

This option allows you to determine the quantity of delivery prescription tickets to print.

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
